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For information about the structure of the articles, the authors should read the instructions bellow. It is also suggested to refer to the latest issue of the journal (available online).

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Research papers, short communications, as well as review articles and commentaries (the two latter are only accepted by invitation) that address scope of the journal will be considered for publication. The Articles should include title page, abstract, keywords, introduction, experimental details, results and discussion, acknowledgement, references, tables, figures, and legends, enumerated from the title page. While there are no fixed limitations to the length of an article, authors are asked to write their manuscripts in a clear and concise manner and to include only data crucial to arriving at their final conclusions. **Short Communications** are preliminary

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**Abstract:** This should not be structured but should include the title, aims, methods, results, and conclusion. It should not be more than 250 words.
